In this new self-paced course, educators take a comprehensive look at mental health issues in students, updated with resources for the coronavirus pandemic. Topics include depression and anxiety, trauma and toxic stress, and mental health interventions. It teaches educators how to listen and to foster connections and a sense of safety to help students, both in-person and online.

Suicide Prevention Train-the-Trainer Refresher Course

This one-hour self-paced course is a guide for school-based or community-based mental health professionals to train school staff to lead Kentucky's suicide prevention course for students in grades 6-12. Topics include how to give students a voice in the training, how to recognize signs of suicidal ideation, how to deal with social media pressures, and how students can find help for themselves or their peers in distress.

The course also examines how schools can support student well-being by taking a strength-based perspective on mental health. This course is designed to be a mid-year refresher offered prior to going into winter break.
